Cincinnati Police Department – Captain Mike Neville

Positive feedback regarding police on foot patrol and bikes, decline in crimes and activity
Drug dealer apprehended, attorney requested lesser offense, may need DRC & residents support...

Cincinnati Fire Department – Daniel? – Broadway station

350 runs currently/386 overdoses – March/815 for quarter; highest area of usage Price Hill & Springdale

Spring Cleaning – Reminder to check smoke detectors monthly/Change batteries

Clean laundry dryer hose & lint traps (fire hazard)

Careful when using extension cords, not meant to be permanent

Ambassadors Report – Carlos Davis

Opening Day Parade – Success/street cleaned timely manner afterwards

Transients (not from Cincy) decline subsequent abuse treatment, but purchase drugs here

No arrests unless they're found with drug paraphernalia

Consistent report that drug issues are down

Speakers:

Judge Kurt Kissinger – Hamilton County Municipal Court, Room 124, 513-946-5138 (Concerns, please call)

2 years downtown resident, Sycamore Place

Handles misdemeanor crimes that affect us; criminal trust past, domestic violence, shop lifting, robberies, etc.

Unresolved issues – limited ability to hold offenders long enough to get them help they need for drug treatment

Jails overcrowded (capacity 1240/last count over 1421)/ constant battle with limited resources (female/men)

180 days Maximum jail time/treatment not very successful/Casey's Law – not utilized often

Many mental health issues/some folks don't want treatment/encourages detox before coming to court

Changes in DUI/OBI Laws – increase penalties for 1st time offender – will see a lot more same offenders

Body camera – many issues – subject to discovery/timeliness is not good



Housing Ordinance – limited resources

Concerns why offenders are let go without discussing with the judge who placed them in confinement

Positive Success Story is AIW, which are women who made it through the program and achieved their goals

Recommend talking to youth and educate them on the dangers of drugs, etc. – early intervention

Bob Mecum – Consultant

With 3CDC to work with downtown businesses and residents to analyze panhandling issues and find a way

The goal is to reduce or eliminate/will gauge attitudes and perceptions with a survey

Gary Bryson will email the survey for all residents to complete and return, asap

On completion of surveys the data will be consolidated and shared with the organizations to work strategies

Bob has benchmarked this type of issue in other major cities

The work that's been started in Cincinnati, thus far will be implemented into these efforts

Ambassadors will play a major part in this endeavor, to engage visitors to the city and the panhandler

Partnering with DCI, Chamber of Commerce, DRC and OTR organizations
