#### **Cincinnati Police Department – Capt. Mike Neville**

Status of incidents around library & Piatt Park

14 felony arrests (used assistance from other units)

Overall crime is down in the CBD– due to efforts done by police force

Believe in getting people help versus locking them up

Concerns: cars running red lights – police track locations where majority of accidents (major challenge)

Concerns: large number of motorcyclists – loud noises (another challenge)

#### **Cincinnati Fire Department Captain George (Engine 3)**

21 Fires

311 (Emergency Medical Runs) EMR (82%)

Avg. 12.5 runs per day

Oct. Fire Prevention Month (replace smoke detectors every 10 yrs. {check date on back})

Check batteries monthly/change every 6 months – helpful reminder during Daylight Savings

Place smoke detectors Outside bedroom doors/high up on ceiling

Oct. 13 Memorial event on Central Avenue

Sept. gave out Narcan in CBD cases (increased at the end of August and appear to slow down in the last few weeks) Narcan is the First and Only FDA approved nasal naloxone.

It's used to treat narcotic overdose in an emergency situation and cost approximately \$38 per dose.

Sept. cleaned out fire hoses (warning to stay away if see them in process)

Oct. maintenance of fire hydrants (grease & oil)
